Curriculum Change—Mathematics

The College was a pilot school for year 11 Mathematics curriculum change in 2021. From term 1 2022 all year 11 and 12 students have 2 Mathematics subject options:

1. New Curriculum is - Life mathematics

Life Mathematics is for students who do not require specialist knowledge of Mathematics in their career

2. Current curriculum is - Pure Mathematics

Recommended for students who plan to undertake Mathematics, Science, Technology, IT, Medicine, Engineering or a strong interest in Maths.

Transport Assistance Application

Reminding parents /guardians that those who qualify for bus assistance need to reapply for 2022 bus assistance. The students are to inform their Year Teachers if they have not done this and fill the application form that is available in the school office.

For lost cards, students must see the School admin officer and fill in a lost card form which they will need to submit to any Vodafone office.

Reminders

- 1. All enrolment from year 9 13 has closed.
- 2. All students are to update their student bio data with the required information. These forms are given out by year teachers.
- Textbooks textbooks are issued to students.
 These textbooks must be properly kept and students must take responsibility of care for their textbooks.
- 4. Late arrivals—students leaving within the school home zones or traveling by transport are often late to school missing out on valuable form time and in some cases period 1. Parents are requested to ensure that students reach school before or by 8.00am. Frequent late arrivals by your child without any genuine reason may result in counseling and parental intervention.
- 5. **Students early departure** students will not be released unless parents or declared guardian comes to school to pick them up.
- 6. **School uniform** your child/ward must wear the correct school uniform at all times. Proper footwear and hairstyle must also be adhered to (as indicated in school rules).
- Parents/guardians must ensure that students get enough time at home for studies. Parents/guardians are requested to take out time for their child/ward and assist them with their school work.

School code of conduct/ethics

- All students must follow the stipulated school rules. Parents/guardians and students must be well versed with the College rules.
- Mobile phones Students are not allowed to bring mobile phones or any other electronic gadgets to school without approval from Principal. Any student bringing mobile phone, electronic gadget must deposit it in the school office as soon as they arrive to school and take it back in the afternoon when school ends.
- Loitering in Valelevu/Nasinu/Nasole It has been noticed that students loiter around Valelevu, Nasinu and Nasole areas in the afternoon till 5.00pm. The school ends at 3.25pm (Monday Thursday) and 3.15pm on Friday. Students have been strictly told to catch the first bus home or walk straight home.

Parents/guardians need to ensure that they also monitor the movement of their child/ward and see that these children reach home on time.
