2	Discrimination	B	when a dominant culture absorbs or takes over an existing culture. For example, an Indian woman marrying into a Fijian family.
3	Segregation	C	process whereby one keeps his or her own culture and adopts good things from other cultures, for example, i-Taukei learning to make roti, Indian males wearing Sulu yakataga.
4	Assimilation	D	normally occurs in society where many races of people are living together. It is when one favours his/her own race over the others in terms of jobs, admission to institutions and use of facilities.
5	Ethnocentrism	E	refers to the many ethnic groups living together with various cultural characteristics
6	Acculturation	F	are those things you would like to acquire
7	Apartheid	G	means believing that one's own ethnic group or culture is superior. It is based on the view that one's own group is the centre of everything and is the most important.
8	Prejudice	H	a strong feeling of like or dislike towards someone or something. It is not based on reason or experience.
9	Integration	I	originated in South Africa whereby people of different races were separated and made to live apart for example, "schools for whites only".
10	Cultural Diversity	J	means borrowing parts of another culture, while keeping to the basics of your own culture.
		K	usually means a powerful group prevents another group from sharing. They either are pushed away, not included in activities or abused and ignored by people
